KEY TO THE GUIDE

1. The Guide covers most, but not all, letters in the Titchener Papers. On a given list, which concerns correspondence of EBT with a given person, earlier correspondence than the first entry may exist. For a complete listing of letters -- without descriptions -- see the Checklist of Correspondents (in the Assistant Archivist's office).
2. The goal of this Guide was to provide clear and concise descriptions of important and interesting letters. Pages 1-9 describe Letters of General Interest; pages 10-12 describe letters on the Congress of 1913; pages 13-56, arranged alphabetically by correspondent, describe letters of individuals, including Titchener Interesting Letters, pages 40-49.
3. An effort was made to provide full cross references to persons and subjects meriting individual lists. Often, however, the correspondence between EBT and a certain person was so concerned with a subject or other person that no effort was made to note every letter which discussed the subject or person. Instead, a general note was made: e.g., SEE SANFORD CORRESPONDENCE, refers to the whole of the EBT - Sanford Correspondence after the date for which the general entry is made.
4. The Yerkes - EBT microfilm has been inspected only partially: to October 25, 1908; the descriptions stop there (see pages 57-58).
5. The Boring - EBT microfilm has not been inspected, but carbon copies and originals of some of the letters have been; and the letters of these dates need not be further inspected when the microfilm is examined to complete the descriptions.
