BISHOP, MORRIS GILBERT ('13, M.A. '14, Ph.D. '26), 1893-1973. Papers, 1941-1963; 20 in. Professor of Romance Literature, University Historian. Consisting almost entirely of research material for Professor Bishop's A History of Cornell (1962), these papers include letters (in part photocopies) from Cornell alumni and staff members giving anecdotes and reminiscences, information from various professors concerning the history of their departments, and printed and mimeographed material such as speeches, reports, and clippings; also, a typescript draft of the book with corrections in Professor Bishop's hand and the carbon typescript copy of the final draft. Among the correspondents are Arthur I. Abelson, Romeyn Ferry, Edwin G. Boring, Gilmore D. Clarke, Arthur H. Dean, Robert M. Ogden, Gustav J. Requardt, Hugh Troy, Maxwell M. Upton, E. B. White, and Walter F. Willcox. In addition, a letter (1941) to Bishop from José Antonio Dávila concerning their mutual interest in the translation of poetry from Spanish to English; a letter (1960) from Charles Stewart Thorp ('40), Chairman of the Cornell Bequest Committee, concerning gifts to the university; and a letter (1963) from Ernest H. Kingsbury ('31) giving an eye-witness account of the dive of Arthur C. Milliken ('24) from the hydraulic laboratory roof into Trip-hammer Pool, a feat mentioned in Bishop's book.
