Summary: Correspondence, travel diaries, official documents, and photographs. Letters from Andrews to his family from Italy, Greece, Crete, and Egypt describing the progress of his archaeological work, personal matters, travels, and activities; an account of the Olympic Games, material pertaining to the Cornell Class of 1895, a gift of Tiffany Favre glass to the university, the University chimes, and athletics. Correspondents include Alfred Emerson, Willard Straight, Hendrik Willem van Loon, and Benjamin Ide Wheeler. Also, correspondence, notes, archaeological squeezes, sketches, and photographs relating to Andrews' years in Athens as a student at the American School of Classical Studies. Includes descriptions of duels at the University of Heidelberg, and trips in Switzerland, Sicily, and the Middle East with his wife Helen Putnam Andrews. Also, letters and sketches from van Loon, and notes, programs, tickets, and a newspaper relating to the 1896 Olympic Games in Athens.

ANDREWS, EUGENE PLUMB ('95), 1866-1957. Papers, 1895-1956; 89 items (in part, photocopies and transcripts). Professor of Archaeology. These additional papers [see 1954-1962 *Reports*] are concerned mainly with Andrews' years in Greece (1895-1897), where, as a student at the American School of Classical Studies in Athens, he used "squeezes" to decipher an inscription placed on the east architrave of the Parthenon in Roman times and found that the words had been written by sycophantic Greek officials in praise of the Emperor Nero; they include a synopsis of his lecture (February 1896) before the American School, the twelve original squeezes, a roll of sketches of their arrangement on the architrave, prints or negatives of Andrews at work on the inscriptions and of the squeezes themselves, and letters to his sister and mother concerning his work on the inscription and other archaeological research. Also included are letters (1895-1896, 1901) to his family written from Europe, describing duels he witnessed at the University of Heidelberg and making other comments on the university and the town, his hiking trip through the Swiss Alps, and his Mediterranean voyages via Sicily and Crete; four letters to Andrews from Hendrik Willem van Loon (1924-1925, 1941), five of van Loon's original pen-and-ink sketches, and one photograph of the writer; a letter (1936) from a former student, Donald W. Brown ('25), describing the Easter morning he spent in Paris; Christmas letters (1943, 1947-1949, 1951-1953, 1956) from Andrews and his wife, Helen Putnam Andrews, to friends and former students, recalling his time in Greece and their travels in the Near East and elsewhere; and programs and tickets for the 1896 Olympics in Athens, which Andrews attended, as well as notes and a Greek newspaper concerning the games. September 30, [1895], on the Pei-Ho, approaching Greece; to reach Piraeus at 1 A.M.; describes voyage from Marseilles.

May 10, [1896], Corinth, working at digs there; has not begun Century article yet [appeared June 1897]; another reference to going to Sicily with Heermance.

June 17, 1901, to his mother written on an eastbound voyage; includes P.S. Thurs. [June 20] at Naples, to leave next day for Piraeus.

Saturday, September 14, [1901], to his mother, on westbound voyage; sailed from Piraeus to Crete; and ~~thence west~~ mailed postcard in Canea at Cretan post box ("...the Cretans are taking great pride in their newly-found place among the peoples of the world. . ."); went ashore at Crete with the Formans [Lewis Leaming Forman and his wife; Forman on leave from CU1901]; mentions purchase of fez and its ironing; next stop, Catania; refers to Professor Richardson [Rufus Byam, 1846-1914] director of School of Classical Studies, Athens, 1893-1903; Corinth excavations, 1896-1902] and to Wheeler [to U. of Cal., 1899].
