But the Charles of the terms

- \checkmark 1. A pagoda in the Shanghai area. The sharply-rising points of the roofs are characteristic of southern architecture.
- 2. The Ch'ien Men (lit. Front Gate), leading from the South City (commercial and entertainment) to the North City of Peking (royal and administrative). Sometime after this picture was taken, as traffic increased, tunnels were driven through the city wall to the east and west of the gate, and the central tunnel was no longer used. The marble balustrades of the bridge over the moat have also disappeared.
- Two farm women operating a simple grain mill. The man resting in the foreground probably belongs to the wheelbarrow (an important means of transport on the North China plain) in the right rear. The farm building is of plaster over mud bricks with thatched roof. Picture taken near Tientsin, the port city of Peking.
- \checkmark 4. Buildings of a large, prosperous farm in South China.
- \checkmark 5. A watergate in the city wall of Wenchow, in Chekiang.
- √7. A typical farm house in North China, about 1914.
- ✓ 8. A river scene near Wenchow.
- √ 10.-14. Five pictures of canal scenes in the Lower Yangtze Plain, probably in Soochow or Hangchow, the two cities traditionally considered to be models of wealth and refinement. In this region of rice and silk culture there are more canals than roads. The high arched bridges in Nos. 12, 13, and 14 are probably over the Grand Canal, which is wider than ordinary canals. In the 19th century this canal still carried rice and silk from Hangchow in Chekiang to Peking, a distance of over 2,000 kilometers.
- ✓18. A prosperous North China farm, about 1914. A donkey and a mule (?) are drinking at a large watering trough. A donkey and a mule are often teamed together in China.

I see no reason to use the romanization of place names current in the People's Republic, but here it is for reference.

Shanghai is unchanged.
Ch'ien Men becomes Chienmen
Peking is Beijing
Tientsin is Tienjin
Wenchow is Wenzhou
Chekiang is Zhejiang
Soochow is Suzhou

- Cake Chuzenji, near Nikko. The lake is in the crater of an old, extinct volcano. Photo taken in 1914. Note that near the Torii--the gate for a Shinto shrine--there is a large mature, crooked tree next to a small tree. When FRN visited in 1959, the large, crooked tree was gone, and the small tree had approached maturity.
 - 9. Lake Chuzenji, near Nikko, Japan, in 1915.
- ✓ 15. Cryptomeria trees on Lake Chūzenji near Nikko, Japan. The trees were given
 as an offering by Lord Matsudaira some 300 years ago. There are about
 19,000 of them lining 23 miles of roadway.
- √ 16. A stone Buddha beside a Torii at the entrance to a Shinto shrine, Lake Chuzenji near Nikko, Japan.
 - 17. The village of Nikko received its name in the 17th century when the mausoleum of the first Tokugawa shogun, Ieyasu, was built there. The Daiya and Inari Rivers surround the mausoleum complex. This bridge over the Daiya River is plated with gold and therefore is known as the Golden Bridge. It was the only bridge in 1914.
