## NEW YORK STATE FARM BUREAU FEDERATION

With the growth and development of strong county farm bureau associations in all the counties of the state, the need for a federation of these associations into a central body soon became apparent. The agricultural problems of the state are not bounded by county lines. Most of them are rather regional and statewide. The solution of many of these problems requires concerted action on the part of farmers. Moreover, it seemed desirable to have an organization statewide in character which might represent all of the associations in the solution of some of these regional and statewide problems.

As a result, in January, 1917, a call was sent out by the county agent leader for a statewide conference of farm bureau officers and committeemen to meet at the College during Farmers' Week. Thirty-four counties responded to the call, and as a result of this conference the New York State Farm Bureau Federation was organized on February 14, 1917. Its first officers were S. L. Strivings, Wyoming, president; D. V. Farley, Orange, first vice president; W. H. Depew, Cayuga, second vice president; H. C. McKenzie, Delaware, treasurer; and M. C. Burritt, of the central office, ex-officio member of the board. The object of the federation, as stated in its constitution is:

To develop, strengthen, and correlate the work of each of the county farm bureau associations in the state; to encourage and promote cooperation of all representative agricultural organizations in every effort to improve facilities and conditions for the economic and efficient production, conservation, marketing, transportation, and distribution of farm products; to advise with representatives of the public agricultural institutions cooperating with the farm bureaus in the determination of statewide policies, and to inform farmers regarding all movements that affect their interests.

Four committees were appointed to carry forward the program of the federation: (1) legislation, (2) organization, (3) education, and (4) transportation and marketing.

When the federation met at its second annual meeting, during Farmer's Week, 1918, forty of the fifty-four organized counties of the State were represented by duly accredited delegates, twenty-three additional counties having become members since the first annual meeting.

Among the recommendations of this second annual meeting were those for the purchase of power ditchers by the State Food Commission; for the loyal support of the Fourth Liberty Loan; for the appointment of a committee to take steps looking toward the formation of a national federation of farm bureaus; and for the transfer of Farmers' Institute work from the State Department of Agriculture to the State College of Agriculture as a part of the extension service of the College. The old officers were reelected.

At the 1919 meeting of the federation, again held at the College of Agriculture during Farmers' Week, all but four counties in the state were represented. Among the important steps taken at this time were the increasing of the membership fee from a flat rate of \$25 for each county to ten cents for each member enrolled in each county association; the adoption of a program of work for the ensuing year including (1) active encouragement and assistance to cooperative enterprises, particularly those intended to help in the solution of marketing and distribution problems, (2) efforts to secure adequate representation of farmers on commissions, committees, boards, and councils dealing with agricultural problems, and (3) an educational program to present to the people of the State the agricultural situation. The executive committee was also enlarged from five to nine members. Fred Porter, of Essex county, replaced W. H. Depew as vice president, and H. R. Talmage, of Suffolk; H. S. Fullager of Yates. F. M. Smith of Otsego, and C. G. Porter of Orleans were added to the committee.

The fourth annual meeting of the federation was held at Syracuse, in December, 1919. At this meeting every county in the state was represented by delegates, who spoke for a total of 67,000 farmer members. The meeting was characterized by carefully prepared reports of the standing and special committees, by adequate discussions of these reports and of current problems which came before the federation, by affiliation with the national federation, and by the adoption of a comprehensive program of work.

Syracuse was the meeting place of the fifth annual meeting held on December 1 and 2, 1920. Forty-four accredited delegates were present. The reports of committees showed much constructive work accomplished during the year, including feed legislation; the repeal of the daylight-saving law; the extension of the scope of junior project work; the operation of a speakers' bureau to present farmers' problems to city audiences; the development of canning-crops cooperatives, and the investigation of the maple-syrup industry.

The 1920 Program of the New York State Farm Bureau Federation  
(Adopted December 9, 1919)

General procedure

1. Every county a federation member.
2. Cooperate with College in operating a state farm bureau.
3. Follow a definite program.
4. Operate under a budget system.
5. Join American farm bureau federation.

Educational projects

1. Operate a speakers' bureau.
2. Advise on administration of college extension work.
3. Study rural school problems and present a farmers' program.
4. Develop agricultural publicity.
5. Study drainage needs of farmers, and recommend appropriate legislative action.
6. Take action looking toward the reestablishment of pre-war rural delivery service and its future improvement.



Legislative proposals

1. A more flexible budget system for the Agricultural College and Experiment Stations.
2. Feed legislation compelling the marking of packages with both contents and analyses, and more severe penalties for adulteration.
3. Repeal of the State daylight-saving law.
4. No compulsory health insurance.
5. Enactment by Congress of the Capper-Hershman Bill.
6. Better-seed legislation.
7. More stringent laws for trespassing.
8. Legislation tending to encourage the construction of a system of highways known as "county and township highways," and to secure proper and adequate appropriation of state funds for the expansion of highways under such a system.
9. Completion of the trunk-line system of roads as outlined by the 1917 road map on file in the State Engineer's office.
10. The limiting of the weight of the truck plus the weight of the load of motor vehicles to the weight-bearing capacity of the state roads as now constructed, and the limiting of the width of the load sufficiently to allow the safe passage of other vehicles.
11. For reasons of economy, that state roads be constructed of more than one material.

Marketing and transportation projects

1. List all cooperative associations. Aid like associations to centralize their efforts.
2. Oppose the principle of price fixing by government agencies.
3. Oppose trade discrimination against cooperative societies for buying and selling.
4. Demand adequate representation on all investigating commissions.
5. Aid College of Agriculture in certifying seeds and in organizing associations for the production of certified seeds.
6. Cooperate with joint committee on refrigerator-car service.

Organization projects

1. Assist in establishing junior project work in each county.
2. Formulate plans for the conduct of farm and home bureau work.
3. Cooperate with the State Federation of Home Bureau Associations in the organization of farm and home bureau and junior project work.
4. Conduct a central-purchasing and a pooled-advertising agency.
5. Assist county organizations in their membership drives.

THE NEW YORK STATE FARM BUREAU FEDERATION

Office Headquarters - Roberts Hall, Ithaca, New York.

1. When Organized:

A. February 14, 1917.

2. Reasons for Organization of Federation:

- A. To provide machinery through which the programs of the various county farm bureaus may be correlated and through which state wide programs may be developed.
- B. To provide farmers with organization facilities totally unattached from public or governmental funds to attain the following advantages.
  - 1. To view educational and research programs strictly from the farmers' point of view.
  - 2. To advise with all types of groups, commercial and non-commercial, in connection with programs and policies designed to improve facilities for economic and efficient production, conservation, marketing, transportation, and distribution of farm products.
  - 3. To assist farmers in studying the influence of public policies upon agriculture.
  - 4. To express publicly the farmers' point of view, based upon farmer analysis, in connection with all types of problems, including such things as legislation, transportation, taxation, highway construction, development of marketing facilities, agricultural credit, development of rural electrification, rural education both child and adult, land utilization and the like.

3. Type of Organization:

- A. Non-commercial membership organization.
- B. Educational financed by private membership fees.
- C. Membership includes the members of the county farm bureaus which elect to hold membership in the New York State Farm Bureau Federation. County farm bureaus electing to be a part of the Federation assume the responsibility for membership solicitation. The state federation receives \$1.00 for each member, 50 cents of which is forwarded to the American Farm Bureau Federation.
- D. Farmer owned and controlled.

4. Organization Structure:

- A. 26,314 members located in 49 agricultural counties.
- B. Members elect county delegates to represent them in annual meeting of the New York State Farm Bureau Federation. Counties with less than 900 members are allowed 1 delegate. Counties with more than 900 members are allowed 2 delegates.
- C. County delegates nominate and elect, in annual meeting, the directors, president, 1st vice-president, 2nd vice-president, and treasurer.

5. Board of Directors and Officers:

A. Structure.

The president, 1st vice-president, 2nd vice-president, and treasurer each elected for a term of one year together with four directors each elected for a term of four years with the Director of Extension serving as ex-officio comprise the board of directors. The General Secretary is selected and employed, full time, by the board of directors.

B. Duties.

The board of directors has supervision over all the affairs of the federation. It may adopt such rules and regulations for the conduct of its business as shall be deemed advisable and may in the execution of the powers granted, appoint such agents as it may consider necessary.

6. Committee System:

A. How Operated:

At the discretion of the board of directors regular and special committees may be appointed by the president for general or specific functions. The committees may be confined to the board of directors and officers or they may be set up entirely outside the personnel of the board.

B. Advantages of committee system:

- 1. More thorough analysis of problems involved.
- 2. More extensive farmer participation.
- 3. Greater confidence in programs on the part of the membership.
- 4. Greater public confidence in federation projects.

C. Committees Now in Operation:

- 1. Legislative
- 2. Transportation
- 3. Dairy

7. How Programs are Developed:

A. Farmer Participation:

The fundamental of sound program building in a farm organization rests largely in farmer participation with technical facts gained from research institutions and practical facts gained from experience.

B. Origin:

Most of the programs and projects of the state federation originate in farmer committees of the county farm bureaus for that is the point where most of the problems come to light.

The problem is then referred to the office of the federation in Ithaca where it is handled by the general secretary directly or else referred to the proper committee.

The federation committees study and analyze problems and draft tentative programs to be referred to the boards of directors of the county farm bureaus.

The boards of directors of the county farm bureaus may register approval, disapproval, or amendment by proxy or through their delegate or delegates at the annual meeting.

Practically all of the state wide projects and especially the public policies are determined by the delegate body in annual meeting.

All programs are subject to final approval of the board of directors of the state federation.

8. Execution of Programs:

It is the duty of the general secretary to guide the administration of the program of the organization and carry out the policies formulated by the board of directors.

9. Fundamental Principles:

In dealing with public problems and public policies of interest to farmers the organization has attained a reasonable degree of success. It has been favored with high class farmer leadership. It has endeavored to keep its program in line with facts as established by research. It has gained respect as a public spokesman for farmers by adhering to educational and public programs. It has always been operated by farmers who are making their living from farming.

## THE AMERICAN FARM BUREAU FEDERATION

### 1. When Organized:

A. 1919

### 2. Purpose:

A. To provide an agency for the correlation of the programs of the various state farm bureaus.

B. To study national farm problems and to express the farmers' point of view concerning national affairs.

### 3. Type of Organization:

A. Non-commercial.

B. Farmer owned and controlled.

C. Farmers elect to membership through their state federations.

D. Governed by 14 directors together with the president and vice-president. The officers and directors are elected by the state delegates at the annual meeting of the A.F.B.F.

E. Programs are developed in annual meeting, by regular and special farmer committees and by the board of directors.

### 3. How Financed:

A. Membership Fees:

In case the state federation elects to belong to the A.F.B.F. the state federation acts as collecting agency for the A.F.B.F. and the County Farm Bureaus in turn act as collecting agencies for the state federation. The dues paid to the A.F.B.F. amount to 50 cents per member.

### 4. Program Development:

The programs and projects of the A.F.B.F. are developed along similar lines as that outlined for the state federation. The executive officers are responsible for the administration of the program.
