Letter from George B. Roane, President of the Templar Knights Commanders Assoc. (Jan. 23, 1923) to W. S. re an invitation to W. S. to speak for the group.

Copy of letter from W. S. to Hon. Frederick M. Davenport, Clinton, N. Y., (Sept. 10, 1914). Davenport was the other candidate besides W. S. for the Progressive's nomination for Governor in the primary. Sulzer suggests debates between the two to decide who should receive Progressive support.

It met its Waterloo at St. Paul. The 'dry' organization did it. We are now in the struggle for law enforcement. This responsibility rests upon both parties alike. The new anti-papal party organized recently in St. Louis is nearer the mark."

News Clipping from New York Nation (pub. weekly by Nationalist Pub. Co., M.T. O'Reilly, Ed.). A column (N.D.) praising W.S. and stating that there is no doubt about his re-election to Congress.

W.G. Tanner (?), Seattle, to W.S. (Sept. 6, 1922). Re mining in Washington State area.

W.S. to Chester C. Platt, Madison, Wisconsin (Jan. 31, 1921). States his friends organized "American Party" to bring about his election as New York State Governor; explains why they chose the Prohibition Party nomination rather than the Democrat or Independent; says he opposed the 18th Amendment and Volstead Act but would have supported a high excise tax; and criticizes the above laws.

W.S. Edwards, Phoenix, Arizona, to W.S. (Jan. 26, Feb. 9, 1923) re some of W.S.'s financial transactions.

I think it is sure to come up in the campaign and the action of the Democratic members who are acting with the Republicans will rise up to curse the party and them."
