The bulk of this collection consists of impression copy letter books (97 vols., 1857, 1867, 1871-1908) and files of incoming correspondence (1880-1911) dealing with the business interests of H.W. Sage and W.G. Grant (1854-1861), lumber manufacturers at Bell Ewart, Ontario, Canada; Sage, McGraw and Company (1864-1869) and H.W. Sage and Company (1869-1893), lumber manufacturers at Wenona, Michigan; and Henry W. Sage and John McGraw (1864-1878), H.W. Sage and Company (1869-1893), and the Sage Land & Improvement Company (1893-c.1930), investors in timber lands. There are also thirty-eight boxes of tax receipts and miscellaneous materials (1829-1930) and approximately fifty scattered ledgers, day books, journals, land and plat books of W.H. Sage and Company, as well as one volume of minutes of the Loggers Boom Company (1883-1905).

The almost daily letters of H.W. Sage to his son, Dean (1871-c.1895) present a continuous commentary on all the interests and commitments of the central figure in the collection, H.W. Sage. From 1871-1893, a major portion of the correspondence deals with the lumber and salt mill at Wenona and interests peripheral to it: the Albany, New York City, and Toledo lumber yards of H.W. Sage and Company; the Michigan Salt Association; the Au Gres, Rifle River, Tittabawassee, and Loggers Boom Companies; the political and economic life of Wenona (West Bay City after 1877), Michigan.

A second major subject of the collection is the acquisition and administration of timberlands. Letters to and from George S. Frost (1881-1886), L.V. Ripley (1880-c.1905), and Frank Pierson (c.1890-1905), are most relevant for Michigan investments; to W.S. Patrick (1867, 1871-1873), to and from D.P. Simons (1875-1909) and L.V. Ripley (1880-1905), for Wisconsin; to and from H.A. Emery (1888-1893) and Martin Van Heuvel (1893-1897), for Alabama and Mississippi; from D.P. Simons (1902-1906), for Oregon; from D.P. Simons (1904-1909), D.P. Simons, Jr., (1909-1912), and E.J. James (1912-1916), for California.

From about 1880 H.W. Sage and Company began to invest heavily in railroad and a few industrial securities. Correspondence (1880-1910) with Wood Heustis and Company, Dominick and Dickerman, Griswold and Gillette, the Atlantic Trust Company, William H. Hale, Samuel D. Davis and Company, Daniel T. Worden and Company, all of New York City, and Farson, Leach and Company of Chicago, among others, deals with this aspect of the company's affairs. In this period also H.W. Sage and Company corresponded with Augustus Frank and E.O. McNair of the Bank of Warsaw, New York, with regard to investments in county bonds.

There is a scattered correspondence with A.R. Culver (1880-c.1886), A.S. Barnes (1880-1886), H.G. Bond (1880-1886), and William C. DeWitt (1882-1896) concerning Sage's interest in rapid transit lines in Brooklyn; with A.S. Barnes, A.G. Curtin, and George S. Coe (1881-1888) with regard to investment in the Tehuantepec Canal project in Mexico.

H.W. Sage and Company corresponded with E.D. Jackson (1892-1897) concerning mortgage investments in Minneapolis; with the Kansas Loan and Trust Company of Topeka (1883-1892), the Central Loan and Land Company of Emporia (1884-1896), and the Western Farm Loan Mortgage Trust Company of Lawrence (1888-1892) concerning mortgage loans in Kansas; with Stull Brothers of Lincoln, Nebraska, with regard to mortgage loans in Kansas and Nebraska; and with the Lewis Investment Company (1889-1896) concerning mortgage investments in and around Des Moines, Iowa.

A scattered correspondence (1870-1895) with Andrew D. White, Amasa Parker, Erastus Brooks, DeWitt Warner, Stewart A. Woodford, Alonzo B. Cornell, and A.S. Barnes demonstrates H.W. Sage's concern for Cornell University, whose interests he served as trustee and benefactor.
