The greater part of the Bert Lord Papers deal with political and business correspondence. There is little personal correspondence, and practically no reference whatever to members of the Lord family. The few letters that deal with Afton, Lord's home town, relate primarily to local political offices, local road construction, etc. There are, besides the correspondence, an appreciable number of bills and receipts for the years centering around 1914 and 1920-24. There are a few unimportant pamphlets, a few miscellaneous forms such as a "Primary designating petitions for party nomination" etc., and some newspaper clippings, but no diaries. The larger part of Lord's political correspondence falls in the years 1914, 1916, and 1920.

Lord had business interests of importance apart from his political career. The manuscripts illustrating his business career occur chiefly in the years 1914 and 1920-24. He was partner in the firm Lord and McHugh, General Merchandise, Afton, N. Y. This company had extensive lumber milling interests as well. The extent to which Lord played a prominent role in the business operations of Lord and McHugh while he held public office is not clear, but there are a few large business orders addressed to him by the D & H R.R. while he was in the Assembly. Prominent among his business interests were the Delaware and Hudson Railroad, South Coast and Northern Lumber Company, and the Wayne Lumber Company.

Much of the political correspondence deals with routine matters: patronage, bills relating to prohibition ^{enforcement} ~~repeal~~, raising teachers' salaries and pensions, Daylight Saving Time, highway construction, veterans' benefits, and women's prison reforms.

In the collection there is perhaps material of value for the historian interested in the workings of local American politics; for example, the manner in which the parties operate on the county level, the process by which a man gets his party nomination for state assembly or senate, the amount candidates must contribute to party campaign funds, the help given to candidates by the state party chairman, and the use of campaign (trains) Highly instructive, too, are the political maneuverings and antagonisms within Chenango County, which come out rather perceptibly in the letters. Likewise, the direct primary, then (1914) just making its debut in American politics, is regarded with general optimism. As one of the correspondents expresses it, "Our beautiful new direct primary." (Loomis to Lord, July 20, 1914).

Many of the letters are important in revealing developments in New York agriculture. Lord conducts a poll of farmers in his district regarding the value to farmers of literature distributed by the State Department of Agriculture. From perhaps 40 or 50 returns the conclusion appears inescapable that farmers were profiting little from the efforts of the department. The returns from the poll depict widespread farmer complaints: the increase of farm abandonment, the migration of rural workers to the cities, with the resultant extreme shortage of farm labor, and farmer antipathy to the eight-hour work day. (See especially Edwin S. Moore to Lord, February 23, 1920). Important, too, is the extensive political activity of the Dairymen's League: for example, its strong support of the 18th Amendment, partly because of "the increased use of milk made possible by the absence of intoxicating liquors," (March 19, 1920) and their fierce opposition to "Hebe," a milk substitute put out

by the Carnation Milk Company of Seattle. At times, also, interesting bits come to the surface on the struggle of the City of New York vs. the State dairymen over fixing milk prices.

Lord's participation in the so-called "socialist controversy" of January, 1920, demonstrates the wave of hysteria that arose in the wake of the Bolshevist Revolution. Lord supported the policy of excluding six elected socialists from the State Assembly Chamber. Socialists were to him "inimical to the Government of the United States" and "traitors to their country". Those of foreign birth should be deported from the country.

Also of note are the letters dealing with 1) his campaign to limit the size of newspaper headlines, which generally evoked an unfavorable reaction, 2) one letter from a Binghamton businessman is a classic example of an uncouth businessman who expects political favoritism (F.R. Nelson to Lord, Nov. 5, 1914). 3) Letters from such concerns as the "Gale News Syndicate" and the Columbian Information Bureau show the existence of companies who would promptly supply a candidate for office with a good sound Republican speech, "carrying conviction, typewritten, double spaced and on good paper" - all for the modest sum of \$5.

(Mostly May 1918-December 1919). Also articles on the death of Congressman John D. Clarke and the election of Lord to take his place. Articles on Theodore Roosevelt's family, the AAA, the NRA, James Farley, and the engagement of the daughter of Nicholas Murray Butler. Unused post cards (~~some~~) and thirty or forty pictures of Republican politicians. (1931-1934).
3. Mostly 1934. Articles on the milk reduction plan, the Department of Agriculture and Markets, New Deal prosperity, government interference in business, New York City politics, Farley for Governor, taxes and more taxes, farming, highways, and Lord's election to Congress. Also a few poems about Lord and a few of his campaign advertisements.
4. Clippings on the death of Ralph J. Griswold, messages of the President to Congress, an Herbert Lehman, the defeat of the World Court plan in this country, the Cooperstown postoffice, the Lord plan to aid the needy, Lord's discussion with Norman Thomas, opposition to the Fatman Bonus Bill, politics of the Republican party in the 34th Congressional district, dairy industry, potato crop controls in Broome County, Lord's woodlot survey plan, farm to market roads, the Townsend movement, the Japanese as a menace to trade, improved mail service to Oxford, N.Y., speeches by Lord, the unconstitutionality of the NRA, New York State flood control program, the postoffice in Binghamton, election returns, the campaign of William Lemke, the 1936 elections and convention programs. Also articles by Mark Sullivan, Rep. Bertrand Snell, and Walter Lippman.

5. Mostly 1931-34. Articles on the movement begun by Lord during the depression buy products manufactured in New York State, the death of John. D. Clarke in an auto crash, campaigns for and elections to Congress, 1934 election results, articles on Kress, Lord's opponent, bills sponsored by Lord, other election contests, activities of FDR.
6. Articles on scattered local and national issues. Much on the court-packing plan of Roosevelt's. Copies of Lord's remarks from the Congressional Record. Articles on the reorganization bill.
7. Results and articles on the 1936 primaries and elections. Lord's request for drought relief aid, Copies of Lord's speeches and clippings about them. Articles on the activities of Alf Landon and Dr. Townsend. About fifty pieces of national campaign material and pamphlets. Campaign ads from local newspapers. Articles on other elections in the state. Fifty-eight page pamphlet by Herbert Hoover entitled "American Idealism."
8. General articles from national newspapers. Photos of Lord. Articles on the tariff, reciprocal trade, the shoe industry, Lord's votes in Congress, and his decision to seek re-election. Mostly 1937.

Also, an envelope of clippings, mostly 1936, on farm conditions, the Townsend movement, campaign material, election returns.

The above is, of course, merely a sketchy guide to what is to be found in the various scrapbooks. The scrapbooks have been numbered for convenience, although in no special order.
