Griffith and Hays Families. Records, 1777-1934. 7 pcs. (photostats)

Photostats (4 pcs.) of birth, marriage, and death records from family Bible, beginning with the birth of Soloman Hays, Sr. in 1777 and James Griffith in 1798; marriage records include that of Soloman, Jr. (b. 1821) and Eläza Ann Griffith (1843). Records also contain information on members of the related Alkin, Clark, Henkle [Hinkle], Horbach, Pierce, Landes, and other families. In addition, photostats (3 pcs.) of the will of William Griffith, Sr. of River Raisin, Wayne County, Indiana Territory, made July 25, 1804 and recorded in 1820.

Griffith and Hunt Families. Records, 1827-c. 1900. 10 pcs.

Indenture made, Cct. 9, 1827, between Moses and Polly McCullough, Washington County, Indiana, and James Griffith for sale of land in Brown Township, Washington County, to Griffith; taken from pp. [1117]-112 of public records. Followed (pp. 112-113) by indenture for sale of same land by Griffeth and his wife, Nancy, Oct. 1833. Also, indenture, Mar. 6, 1834, by terms of which John Murphy sold land in Tippecanoe County to James Griffith; recorded Apr. 7, 1836. 5 pcs. (positive photostats). Also, genealogical information set down apparently by a daughter of James and Nancy Griffith, c. 1900; lists parents and brothers and sisters of Nancy Hunt Griffith (b. 1802-d.1850), wife and children of William Griffith,Sr. (d. 1804), including James (b. 1798), and other relatives, whose surnames include Barnes, Ewing, Hungerford, Squires, VanCamp, White, and others. 4 pcs. (negative photostats). Also, one  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " black-and-white snapshot of tombstone .

Re father's [James Griffith, b. 1798] family:

parents came from England

Grandmother Griffith's maiden name was Freefane. D. childbirth when writer's father was 4 yrs. old. Grandfather [William, Sr.] 2 yrs. later in 1804. Both d. in Michigan.

Father b. Cntario County and all eight [seven?] children sent back to N.Y. after parents' death. Grandfather Griffith well off; doesn't know what happened to property. Records destroyed during war [1812?]; ref. to burning of Buffalo.

Father's [James] four sisters:

Charlotte Griffith Ewing Anna Griffith White Sarah Griffith Squires Clara Griffith Hungerford

two brothers: Horatio William (in battle of Tippecanoe)
