
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PILLION, JOHN RAYMOND (C.E. '23, Law '27), 1904-Papers, 1947-1965; 76 ft. Attorney; N.Y.S. Assemblyman, 1941-1950; U.S. Congressman, 39th and 42nd New York Districts, 1953-1964; member of Appropriations and Interior and Insular Affairs Committees and Public Works, Post Office, and Treasury Subcommittees. Include correspondence with constituents concerning immigration cases, servicemen's and veterans' affairs, appointments to the U.S. Military, Naval, Air Force, and Merchant Marine Academies, and other matters of special concern to residents of his congressional district; alphabetical card indexes of action taken on each constituent's request; and correspondence, hearings, justifications, and working papers concerning appropriations for the Atomic Energy Commission, Department of the Interior, Post Office Department, the St. Lawrence Seaway, the Treasury, and other government departments, commissions, and agencies. Also, legislative and general correspondence and information files concerning state or local projects involving the N.Y.S. Barge Canal System, other inland waterways, Erie County flood control, Kinzua Dam, Buffalo harbor, Buffalo International Airport, and the N.Y.S. Thruway and other highways; Representative Pillion's opposition to statehood for Alaska and Hawaii, including correspondence with Dr. Lyle G. Phillips of Honolulu (1954-1964) and members of the Hawaii Residents Association; the Antarctic Treaty and his trip to Antarctica (November 1959), with his comments on the scenery, weather, mapping, and commercial fishing of that continent; national issues, such as agricultural policy, civil defense, irrigation and reclamation, the Federal Reserve System, the national debt and other fiscal and tax matters, public school prayer, Medicare, and the space program; and foreign policy and international affairs, such as the "Bay of Pigs" invasion, the status of Berlin, the Southeast Asian situation, reciprocal trade, American investments abroad, the balance of payments, the nuclear test ban treaty, NATO, the Common Market, and Communism. Also, copies of bills he introduced into Congress, speeches, news releases, tape recordings, questionnaires, clipping scrapbooks, and loose clippings from newspapers and periodicals. Lawyer; legislator. John R. Fillion served as a New York State Assemblyman from 1941 to 1950 and United States Congressman from 1953 to 1964.
