RE: CATTARAUGUS COUNTY TUBERCULOSIS & HEALTH ASSOCIATION

In the 1960's, most of the county tuberculosis and health associations were combined into regional associations, and local offices were eventually closed.

At this time, the files of the Cattaraugus County Health Association were turned over to the Regional History Archives (now the Rare and Manuscript Collections) of Cornell University's Kroch Library at Ithaca, New York. The four large cartons of files were assigned the number 2890.

The files were given to Cornell because Cattaraugus County had established the first rural health department, and the Tuberculosis Committee (later the Health Association) having spearheaded this accomplishment had much valuable historical information in its files. The transfer was made with the approval of the Association's Board of Directors and at the request of the Cornell Library Archivist.

In November 1994, copies of a few of the early records were obtained by Betty Eaton, former Health Ass'n. executive director. They are now in the files of the Olean Historical and Preservation Society, in a separate acid-free box marked "Health Association."

One report deals also with the health demonstration in Syracuse and is a chronological report of the two demonstrations from May 1922 to December 1930.

Other publications deal with underweight school children of Olean, Rocky Crest Sanitorium (annual reports for 1930 and 1933), Open Air Crusades (1913), rebuilding crippled children, school health education in the county, finding TB cases, etc.


