From these halls, Sectarianism must be forever excluded, all students must be left free to worship God, as their conscience shall dictate, and all persons of any creed, or all creeds must find free, and easy access, and a hearty and equal welcome, to the educational facilities possessed by The Cornell University.

Corducation of the sexes, and entire freedom from sectarian or political preferences, is the only proper and safe way, for providing an education that shall meet the wants of the future, and carry out the founders idea of an institution where "any person can find instruction in any study" I hermitte commit this great trust to your care.
