

Belvidere Oct 27th 1860

Dear Brother

Your letter of Sept. 10th stating that you could let me have \$500, by the middle of January and asking me if Mr Cunningham could accomodate himself to those circumstances, was duly received and answered since which I have not heard from you. - I wrote you that if you could let me have \$50, by the middle of this month, I could manage with him about the ballance untill the time you mention^{ed}, he is getting impatient to know what I am going to do. I feared that my letter had not reached you or perhaps you have written one that I have not yet received

I had a letter from James
Finch yesterday, they are in
Usual health, he wrote that
they had been to visit John at
Detroit and that they were well
except ^{one} of the little ones which has
the ague and is quite feble,
We are quite well, we are now
having a series of political Mass
meetings in this section of county
the Hon John P Hale is stump-
ing the state for Old Abe, I heard
him last wednesday, we expect
to give him a rousing Majority
in this state — Douglas stock is
down low and still declining
